International Day for Women and Girls in Science

In celebration of the international day for women and girls in science on 11th February Youth Advocates Ghana (YAG) held an interactive interview for the female students of the Akwamu Basic School in Nsawam to call attention to the gender gap in science-related fields. Only one third of researchers are female, who still face a lot of discrimination and repudiation in their job and achievements. Our guest speaker Lyna Nana Yaa Amofa, YAG volunteer and science students, familiarized them with a general understanding of science and its importance so that they develop more enthusiasm for corresponding subjects. Under her slogan "PHD-Perseverance, Hardwork and Determination" she broke down potential insecurities and aimed at encouraging the girls to oppose gender stereotypes and consider careers in STEM.



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Youth Advocates Ghana (YAG) in partnership with United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UN ECA) and IOM African Region hosted the youth fixture workshop on Voluntary National Review (VNR) and Voluntary Local Review (VLR) Pre-event Workshop at the 9th Session of the African Regional Forum on Sustainable Development (ARFSD) in Niamey, Niger from February 27-29, 2023. The objectives of the Workshop were to strengthen the capacity of young people to enable them effectively participate and engage in VNR and VLR, and to facilitate the implementation of the VNR and VLR process national and subnational levels.

The workshop, through a hybrid format, hosted 30 young leaders from across African including delegation from the African Youth SDGs Summit, Pan African Youth Union, UN Youth Envoy, and staff from UN ECA and IOM Africa Regional Offices.

YAG engages students on sexual and gender-based violence to commemorate international women's day.



Youth Advocates Ghana (YAG) with support from Planned Parenthood Association, Ghana, last Friday engaged senior high school students on sexual and gender-based violence in Commemoration of the International Women's Day.

The school engagement, implemented as part of the Country Acceleration Strategy (CAS) Initiative funded by African Union Commission and International Planned Parenthood Federation Africa Region, engaged eighty-one (81) students of Prince Boateng Memorial School, Nsawam, on unpacking concept, forms, consequences, and reporting mechanisms of Sexual & Gender-Based Violence (SCBV) in Ghana, a statement issued by YAG copied the Ghanaian Times said.

YAG Marks Menstrual Hygiene Day with Adolescent Boys and Girls in Nsawam.

Menstrual hygiene day is a globally recognized day for celebrating and amplifying the need for reproductive health education for women and girls, particularly how they can maintain menstrual hygiene during their period to prevent infection. In countries like Ghana, this day is used to campaign for the removal of luxury tax on the importation of menstrual products.

In commemoration of this year's menstrual hygiene day, YAG with support from UNFPA Ghana, Global Fund for Children and Global Network of Religion for Children engaged adolescent girls and boys in a school educational outreach program and empowerment sessions. The students were taken through how to practice personal hygiene during menstruation, how to properly use the sanitary pad to avoid staining their clothes, the changes their body go through during this period and how to tend to those changes, and the adolescent boys especially were

educated and advised to embrace menstruation as it is a normal part of the female body. Adolescents girls were empowered and advised to be confident and participate in school activities even when they are in their period. After these sessions, YAG with support from partners distributed sanitary pads to students.
