Established in 2011, YAC has evolved to become a national organization committed to promoting children's and young people's wellbeing through community engagement, partnership and coalition building, national advocacy, youth-led research and international policy convening.

YAC is the initiator and host of the African Youth SDCs Summit, Africa's largest SDCs youth forum that connects young people to learn about the Sustainable Development Coals and empower them to contribute actively to its implementation, monitoring and accountability. The Africa Youth SDC Summit solidifies the mandate to invest in the power and voice of the youth to push the development of the African continent and improve the lives and future of the youth in the region. Through a country rotational convention, YAC ensures the inclusion of young people and the promotion of grassroot initiatives towards the attainment of SDCs YAC is registered with statutory agencies in Chana and holds special



African Youth SDGs Summit

YAG is the initiator and host of the African Youth SDGs Summit, Africa's largest SDGs youth forum. African Youth SDGs Summit is a pan African platform that connects young people to learn about the Sustainable Development Goals and empower them to contribute actively to its implementation, monitoring and accountability. The Africa Youth SDG Summit solidifies the mandate to invest in the power and voice of the youth to push the development of the African continent and improve the lives and future of the youth in the region. Through a country rotational convention, YAG ensures the inclusion of young people and the promotion of grassroot initiatives towards the attainment of SDGs.



SDG Youth Platform on Voluntary National Review in Africa

Youth participation and development are crucial to the implementation achievement of all the SDG targets and indicators. YAG has taken a lead role in facilitating youth-based SDG platforms in Chana and across Africa. Through YAG's partnership UN Fronomic with the Commission for Africa (UNECA), it is working with and mobilizing young people in Chana and Africa to work in the SDGs' accountability process through capacity building training. networking and knowledge sharing to ensure the voice of young people in the Voluntary National Review (VNR) process in Africa.



Youth for Health (Y4H) Project

YAC, in collaboration with Marie Stopes International, Chana (MSI), is leading the charge in Chana to pilot a transformative agenda on social structures and Chana's education workforce to ensure a safe launch and implementation of Reproductive Health Education in Chana's education curriculum through the European Commission funded Youth 4 Health programme in Chana



Youth for Global Financing Facility (Y4GFF) Project

The project seeks to strengthen the capacity of youth-led organization (YLO) to meaningfully engage in the monitoring of the implementation of Chana's Clobal Financing Facility investment case and also, increase evidence-based advocacy around the reproductive, maternal, new-born, child and adolescent health (RMNCAH+N) and NCDs. The project is being funded by the World Bank through PAI.



Free to Flow Programme

Youth Advocates Chana works to empower adolescent girls and boys between the ages of 10-17 through the Free to Flow Project. Through this project, YAG educates both adolescent girls and boys on menstrual hygiene, sexual and gender-based violence while creating safe spaces to advance children's rights in schools and communities, and tackle the root causes of discrimination especially against girls.

SDG Innovation Challenge

YAG is part of a global consortium implementing the SDC Innovation Challenge. The SDG Innovation Challenge was created as a pan-African ideation space for young people to come together in developing and connecting practical solution ideas for challenges faced by their local communities at the grassroots level. The initiative has grown in capacity and impact since 2020, creating space and opportunity for intersection among youth activism, SDG advocacy, and policy-making. Innovation teams that succeed in the SDG Innovation Challenge will compete for award winning packages, continued support, prize money, global recognition and more. The organizers and partners of the SDG Innovation Challenge 2022 – include Youth Advocates Chana (YAG), The Melton Foundation, GrassRoots Hub Chana, TECHFARM Hub, Shibuka, and Spaceship Academy.

Youth for covid-19 Vaccine Uptake Project

YAG is in a new partnership with World Health Organization (WHO) for the Youth for Covid-19 Vaccine Uptake Project in the Bono East, Savannah, Western North and Oti Region. The project seeks to generate demands for Covid-19 vaccination, address myths and misconceptions around vaccination and promote the uptake of Covid-19 vaccination among girls, women and vulnerable groups in districts that have low COVID-19 vaccination rate in Ghana. The project is funded by the Global Affairs Canada through World Health Organization (WHO) Ghana.

Africa-Europe Youth SDGs Cooperation

Following the participation of Emmanuel Aemetepey, the Executive Director of YAG and Convener for the African Youth SDOs Summit in the annual RNE Conference in Berlin, Germany, hosted by the Cerman Council for Sustainable Development, there is an awaken interest and call for Collaborations between the youth in Africa and Europe-YAG further hopes to work with other youth groups in Germany (UN Delegate Programme and the German Youth Council) to roll out initiatives to achieve the Sustainable Development Coal (SDG T7), which seeks to strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development. The partnership areas identified by the goal include finance, technology, capacity building, trade, and systemic issues such as policy and institutional coherence, multi-stakeholder partnership, data, monitoring and accountability.



YAG sees an evident need not only to engage programmatically 'on the ground', but to work towards greater policy engagement with and on the youth's behalf. Such forums where YAG continues to explore deeper engagement include the African Union Heads of State Summit, COP. UN Commission on Status Women (CSW), the United Nations General Assembly, the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development. as Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting. Limited resources coupled with systemic bureaucracies impede our ability to advance meaningful youth engagement. With this in mind, YAG is seeking partnerships with organizations to mobilize resources, develop capacities and explore joint avenues for regional and global level policy engagement using approaches such as policy briefs development, webinar series, policy roundtables and dialogues and side events, among others. YAG's hope is to leverage these platforms to raise young people's voices, a space for them to discuss their and well-being, human rights, sexual reproductive health rights, access to education and their rights to have a promising future with dignity, respect, and inclusivity without leaving no one behind.

One Planet Proiect.

Proposals for scaling up

YAG continues to explore collaborations to scale up its activities on the SDGs in Africa. This will allow YAG to further expand on the following activities:



Scale youth engagement and participation on the SDGs through the annual African Youth SDGs Summit.



Initiate and activate youth engagements that galvanize political commitment and influence policy for a people-centered, just and sustainable development by leveraging on the 2030 agenda for sustainable development and Agenda 2063.



Build the capacity of youth leaders and networks to collect quality data needed to capture underlying development realities for youth.



Enhance state's accountability on SDGs through effective youth participation in voluntary national reviews.



Foster peer exchange between youth in Africa and Europe.



Ensure that young people are capacitated to lead and engage in multistakeholder councils and other processes meant to strengthen the implementation of the SDGS post the VNRs



Equip youth with the skills to leverage technology to create opportunities for collaboration and build networks and to also advocate for issues affecting youth.



Create a sense of ownership of the SDGS among young people.



Generate a youth paper position on the SDGs and Agenda 2063

In Africa, YAG has worked with other local organizations to host African Youth SDGs Summit in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia and in Lussaka, Zambia in 2022 and 2023 respectfully has also coordinated other regional events/meetings in Kigali, Rwanda and Niamey in Niger.

YAG is aware of the enormous challenges that affect adolescents and youth, especially young girls in poor and traditional households and communities.
